Diigo is the most amazing one-click solution for all of your bookmarking/sharing needs. Not only does Diigo allow you to bookmark your favorite websites on the fly, it also lets you easily:

1. Add tags and annotations
2. Create and share lists (i.e. Pete's [Social Networking list](#))
3. Highlight and add sticky notes to bookmarked pages
4. Create open or closed groups (great for project work)
5. Cache (take a "snapshot") of page when bookmarked
6. Granular privacy controls--share what you want, and keep the rest private
7. Sync with Delicious accounts
8. Create a "read later" file, and/or email links to yourself or others
9. Use Diigo to teach AASL Standards
10. Create a special "Educator" account with features specially created for teachers/librarians



Diigo is one of those **rare tools** that is both **easy to use**, and will **change the way you do business** and help you manage the increasing streams of information in your life.
